Information for presenters

PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Oral Presentations – talk 15

- You have 15 minutes in total, including questions. We recommend that you aim for 12 minutes leaving 3 minutes for questions.
- There will be time for further discussion in the breaks, and we have a Q&A timeslot session at the end of each sessions.

Presentation format guideline:

- File type: .pptx
- Aspect ratio: 16:9
- Media: If you use video or audio, make sure they are embedded in the presentation, not linked.

Tips:

- Keep slides clean and readable. Large fonts, clear figures and minimal text. Let your visuals support your talk – not replace it!



PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Speed talks

- Each presenter has 5 minutes for their talk. This does not include time for questions, but there will be time for questions and discussions later in the breaks and in the Q&A timeslots.
- Speed talks are meant to give the audience a quick but impactful look at your work. It's not about squeezing everything in – it's about leaving them wanting more. Focus on what's exciting, surprising, or important about your work.

Speed talk format guideline

- File type: .pptx (You can also use pre-recorded film for your presentation (file type: mp4))
- Aspect ratio: 16:9
- Media: If you use video or audio in your presentation, make sure they are embedded in the presentation, not linked.

Slide tips

- Max 5 slides or fewer
- Use big fonts, clear figures and minimal text
- Avoid dense data – pick 1-2 key points or data.

Speed talk – extra tips!

What makes a 5 min talk great?

- focus on one (or very few) messages. What is the coolest or most important thing about this project?
- Tell a short story, use the classic design: What was the problem/question? What did you do? What did you find? Why does it matter?
- Short, sharp, and memorable. You've got 5 minutes. Make them count!

Poster presentation

- Poster sessions will be held on Tuesday 18:00 – 19:30 and Wednesday 18:30 – 19:30 in the main hall of the conference.
- You may begin to set up your poster during the registration on Monday 08:30 – 11:30.

Poster format guidelines

- We encourage posters to be engaging, visual, and creative – think beyond the traditional scientific poster!
- Please avoid overcrowded text. Try to keep it brief – **max 200 words**.
- Aim to stay within the size: **80cm * 120cm (portrait)**.
- Use large fonts and clear figures
- **Be sure to bring a printed copy of your poster.** Printing will not be available at the venue.
- Be bold and innovative in design – make your poster stand out!
